Palm Sunday

There was a party atmosphere as Jesus entered Jerusalem and many acts of generosity from the crowd. Cloaks were laid on the road, where they would be trampled and ruined; Coats that had a greater value than the coats we wear today. The branches had value too, having been cut to celebrate the Festival of the Booths. Like the cloaks, they were given up in the excitement of celebrating Jesus. The crowds were extravagant in their giving. Many saw Jesus as a hero, the King of the Jews, who had come to save them.
